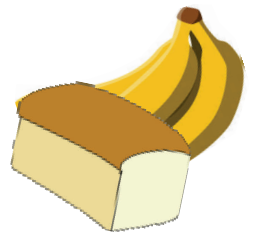
will go towards the Grade 11 class's graduation in 2013. Invite your friends, family and neighbors to come out for an evening of fashion and socializing.

Dear Parents & Guardians of students within Medicine Hat Catholic Board of Education:

During the past several months, our School Division has been upgrading and consolidating our ***Student Information and Reporting System***. As part of this process, we have reviewed the way in which we record and report student absences. Although we have not changed significantly, what is considered an excusable absence, we have changed the way in which these absences are electronically recorded.

In order to keep our parent community informed, we wish to share with you the absence summary utilized in our data base; in particular, when an absence is considered *Excusable* and *Non-Excusable*. Using the *Alberta School Act* as a guide, the summary of absences outlines protocol used to determine how an absence is recorded. The excerpt below, is the reference from the *Alberta School Act* that specifically states what school jurisdictions can deem excusable absences:

- 5) *Notwithstanding subsection (1), a student is excused from attending school on a day on which the school is open if*
1. *the student is unable to attend by reason of sickness or other unavoidable cause;*
  2. *the day is recognized as a religious holiday by the religious denomination to which the student belongs;*
  3. *the principal of the school has suspended the student from school and the suspension is still in effect;*
  4. *the student has been expelled from a school and has not been given permission to enroll in another school, or;*
  5. *the board or, if the student is enrolled in a private school or resides in an unorganized territory, the Minister*
    - (i) *determines that the parent of the student has shown sufficient cause as to why the student should not be required to attend school, and;*
    - (ii) *excuses the student from attending school for a prescribed period of time.*

The Medicine Hat Catholic Board of Education recognizes the above references from the *Alberta School Act* and also recognizes additional reasons in which a student's absence may be considered excusable. Please review the chart on the following page.


## ***Student Attendance Reasons Summary Chart:***

The below criteria will be used at all schools within the Medicine Hat Catholic Board of Education. Some schools may choose to report absence information on progress reports or report cards.

<b>REASON (as recorded in the software)</b>	<b>EXCUSABLE / NON EXCUSABLE</b>	<b>NOTES</b>
<b>Bereavement</b>	EXCUSABLE	Includes: A period of compassionate leave, funeral.
<b>Communicable Disease</b>	EXCUSABLE	Includes: As per Alberta Health Services (Flu, Mumps, Measles, etc.)
<b>Emergency</b>	EXCUSABLE	Includes: Emergency, family crisis, Social Services Intervention.
<b>Illness / Injury</b>	EXCUSABLE	Includes: Medical appointment that is the result of illness or injury.
<b>School</b>	EXCUSABLE	Includes: Suspension, Expulsion, Field Trips, Work Experience, Extra-curricular school activities, tournaments.
<b>Transportation / Weather</b>	EXCUSABLE	Includes: Unable to attend due to transportation. This does not include 'missing the bus'
<b>Inexcusable</b>	NON-EXCUSABLE	Includes: Missed bus, late, working, or unknown.
<b>Medical / Dental Appointment</b>	NON-EXCUSABLE	Includes: All appointments not associated with illness or injury, immunizations, dental, chiropractic, physical therapy, etc.
<b>Parental</b>	NON-EXCUSABLE	Includes: Parent or Guardian ultimately has control of absence or late. Includes out of school sports or fine arts activities, festivals or tournaments not school associated. Family vacations.

The Putting Green Competition was a popular event and the money raised went to the St. Vincent de Paul Society to meet identified needs in the community.

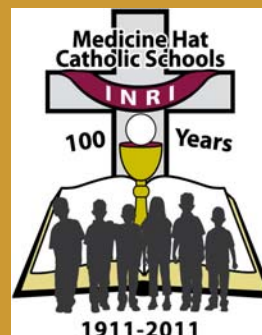

## YOUTH MINISTRY

This year has been an exciting one so far in youth ministry in MHCBE. I have been mainly focused at Monsignor McCoy High School, but visit St. Michael's in Bow Island twice a month for school visits and evening youth groups. I also present a reflection based on the previous Sunday's Gospel reading to the students at Notre Dame Academy and St. Mary's School once per month.

At Monsignor McCoy the climate and culture of the school seems to be slowly changing. With increased attendance at Morning Prayer, monthly masses at the school, service projects, and SEARCH retreats, and an improved respect and openness to our Catholic faith, I am hopeful and excited about the future. This year we have a spiritual leadership team at Monsignor McCoy called "Team Kinect" whose mission is to impact the faith life of the school. We also have the Journey of Faith for Teens program running which we are using to catch youth up on any Sacraments they've missed. After Christmas, we are going to be starting the Theology of the Body for Teens program which teaches youth the truth about Love and Relationships according to the teachings of Blessed Pope John Paul II.

We have a student lounge at Monsignor McCoy where we hold many of these meetings. It also serves as a place for certain groups of youth to belong who didn't necessarily have one before. It's open in the morning and at lunch. It is usually full of youth during lunch time.

In Bow Island, the youth group is growing in popularity. The youth have recently asked me to increase the frequency of the youth nights. Previously, the youth nights were once per month, but there is a desire for more. I am going to start hosting the St. Mike's Youth Group twice per month and see how it goes.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank everyone for their prayers and support for the youth ministry. It is definitely growing and becoming a part of the culture of the schools it ministers to.

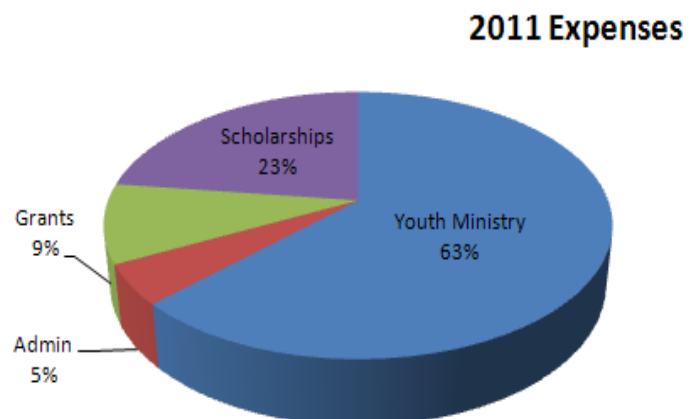
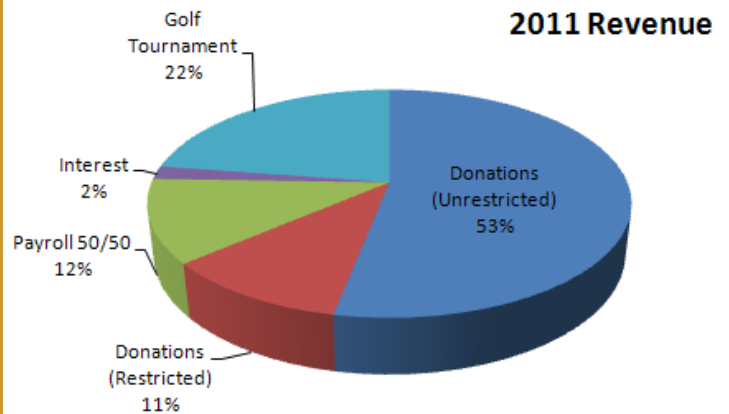

## GRANTS AWARDED in 2011

### Mission Mexico Retreat - \$3,000

**PRESENTATION** – Representatives from Mission Mexico were in attendance to present the Board with an overview of the

**ST. MICHAELS' HIGH SCHOOL REVIEW** – The Board reviewed the 4 recommendations in the St. Michael's High School Program Review. A Board Motion was presented as follows: **THAT Administration is authorized to undertake the Provincial and Board mandated process in order to assist the Board of Trustees as it considers the closure of the high school programming at St. Michael's School in Bow Island**. The vote was recorded as follows: *In Favor:* Peter Grad, Stan Aberle, Jodi Churla, Dick Mastel; *Opposed:* Kelly Van Ham. Moving forward, it will now be the responsibility of the Superintendent of Schools to develop a timeline to go through the process as outlined in the School Closure Regulation. The Board stated they are looking for the exploration of different options as referred to in the review; the Board is interested in researching and determining the viability of those options. Due to current issues related to video-conferencing, the Board noted that no video-conferencing from Medicine Hat to Bow Island will be offered in the second semester in 2012.

**ST. PATRICK'S SCHOOL UTILIZATION** – Over utilization continues to be an issued at St. Patrick's School. Beginning in the 2012-2013 school year, *a hard cap will be applied to cross attendance and registration*. That is, new students who do not live in the natural attendance area will be unable to register unless there is a sibling that already attends and that sibling will be at the school the next year; this practice is know as "**grandfathering**".

**REZONING ST. MICHAEL'S SCHOOL MEDICINE HAT** – The Board approved a change in the attendance zone for St. Michael's School to include the area in **Crescent Heights East of Division Avenue and North of 20<sup>th</sup> Street N.E. including Northlands** rezoned to St. Francis Xavier School. St. Michael's School has a fine arts focus and as a result, is open to all students division-wide, with bussing provided to eligible students from all attendance zones. Parents living in this new attendance zone may continue to send their children to St. Michael's School to access the fine arts program; those parents living in this new attendance zone that are not interested in the fine arts program will register at St. Francis Xavier School.

## CENTENNIAL CELEBRATIONS
